## LAMBING SEASON

We have been informed that the field adjacent to ours will be used for lambing. Since our field has been erected within our boundary line rather than directly on it, the field user will need to install their own fencing to ensure the sheep do not wander near our fence. To help support this development for our field users, we are awaiting the delivery of a thick privacy netting, which we plan to install to help keep the dogs focused and prevent them from getting too distracted. We believe it's best to have the netting in place before the sheep arrive, so the dogs can get used to the new setup gradually. Although we have planted all the way down the fence line it does take time for it to grow which, when it flourishes, will also be an additional support.

## COMMUNITY SUPPORT MEET UP

The feedback was wonderful, and for those of you who wanted to join but couldn't make it, we're pleased to let you know there will be another session in February. ## HELP FOR STREET DOGS



A company called Puggedon has launched an innovative, solar-powered vending machine called "Mamamatic" that provides food and water for stray dogs in Turkey. These clever machines are making a real difference: some operate by trading in cans or plastic bottles, which then release food or water, while others require a small payment of a lira to dispense the essentials.

Currently, you can find these machines in Istanbul, Ankara, and Izmir, and they are proving to be incredibly popular with both dogs and people alike. The best part? They are funded by the money generated from recycling and donations, whether through recycling cans and bottles or paying the lira, these machines are helping to keep street dogs fed and cared for.

It's a wonderful example of how innovation and community effort can come together to make a positive impact on animal welfare.
